Legislative Session Action Report



The 2025 legislative session delivered key wins for Colorado's environment and communities.

Together, we took action and supported legislation to cut climate pollution, expand access to clean energy and the outdoors, protect our water and wildlife and defend public lands from being sold off. We also stopped harmful proposals that would have set back Colorado's climate progress.

These victories are only possible when people come together to advocate for change, and Conservation Colorado plays a unique role as the state's largest environmental organization by bringing people, policy and politics together to protect Colorado's environment and communities. We work to make sure Colorado becomes a place where every community can breathe clean air, drink clean water, protect the landscapes we share and secure our climate future.

Our Collective Wins

Climate & Clean Air



Passed two key policies to expand clean, reliable transit and reduce transportation pollution



Made it easier to bring wind and solar power to communities by installing power lines along highways without harming wildlife



Stopped a bill that would have given tax breaks to energy and water-intensive data centers without environmental safeguards

Environmental Justice



Secured funding for the Outdoor Equity Grant Program to help historically excluded communities access parks and nature, benefiting mental and physical health

Lands And Water



Permanently reauthorized the Colorado Wildlife Habitat Program, which has protected 35,000+ acres of wildlife habitat and opened 150,000+ acres of land for outdoor activities



Improved water quality in areas affected by historic mining and increased funding to address drought threat



Protected public lands from efforts to sell or privatize them

6 priority conservation bills signed into law



250 partner organizations collaborated with us



17 key coalitions joined to strengthen collective advocacy



1,403 emails sent and 561 phone calls made to legislators urging them to act



56 impactful committee testimonies provided by members and staff
