The Islamic Revolution

The Islamic Revolution of 1978-79, is arguably one of the most important events in recent West Asian political history. Led by cleric Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini, the Iranian masses revolted against the regime of Shah Reza Pahlavi, unelected monarch and puppet of imperialist interests, thus putting a definitive end to dynastic rule in Iran.
