# The CELEX number on EUR-Lex

# What is it?

Most documents on EUR-Lex – irrespective of language – have a unique identifier known as a CELEX number.

# Why is it useful?

Celex numbers help you search faster. You can quickly identify document types without opening them.
This is especially useful when viewing metadata in search results or in the 'Document information' tab.

# What is its structure?

4 digits

A CELEX number consists of four parts:

32000L0060

Sector Year Document type Document number

See how the first digit (sector) changes depending on the document type.

### 32000L0060

> original directive

### 02000L0060

> consolidated versions of this directive

### 72000L0060

 national transposition measures (incorporating the provisions into national law) EUR-Lex is divided into 12 sectors:

1: Treaties

1 digit or

1 letter

- 2: International agreements
- 3: Legislation
- 4: Complementary legislation
- 5: Preparatory acts and working documents
- 6: Case-law
- 7: National transposition measures
- 8: References to national case-law concerning EU law
- 9: Parliamentary questions
- O: Consolidated acts
- C: Other documents published in the Official Journal C series
- **E:** EFTA documents

usually 4 6 digits (\*)

1–3 letters usually 4–6 digits (\*)

Examples of **document types (descriptors)** by sector:

**Sector 3: Legislation** 

L directives

**R** regulations

D decisions

Sector 5: Preparatory acts and working documents

- PC European Commission legislative proposals (COM documents), etc.
- other COM documents (green/white papers, communications, reports, etc.)
- **SC/SWD** documents (staff working documents, impact assessments, etc.)
- **DMA/DSA** competition-related documents (e.g. communications related to the Digital Markets Act)

Sector 6: Case-law

- CJ judgments by the Court of Justice
- cc opinions of the advocate-general
- **CO** orders of the Court of Justice

of the European parliament and of the Council of 23 October 2000

Directive 2000/60/EC

establishing a framework for Community action in the field of water policy



Some CELEX numbers (e.g. treaties, national transposition measures) follow a slightly different structure.

(\*) Most document numbers are 4 digits (may be based on the official or internal number), but some may have 5 or 6 depending on the Official Journal number or internal references.
