

To the 16,336 amazing humans who gave through Give!Guide this year.

You did it. We did it! If we could turn your generosity into confetti and shower it all over town, we absolutely would — because you deserve a celebration!

This was no ordinary year, and what you did was extraordinary. Local nonprofits have been stretched thin, with donations down and costs way up, matching national trends. But thanks to you, the \$8,870,380 raised in November and December gave 250 local nonprofits the boost they need to keep making essential services, cultural institutions, and more happen in our community. This is one way we are helping to fix the problems in our own backyard!

We cannot thank you enough for what you've done for these nonprofits. So take a moment and give yourself a huge pat on the back (or a high-five to the nearest person) because this is big. Like, really big. This campaign report is full of fun facts and lists so you can see just how far your generosity went. It's kind of epic.

When this year's campaign began on November 1, our goal was to encourage 17,000 of you to contribute \$8.5 million. We fell short on the number of donors, but 16,336 of you came through in a massive way, blowing past our fundraising goal and landing at \$8,870,380 by the time the clock struck midnight

on New Year's Eve. That's a solid leap from last year's \$8,354,845, and honestly? We couldn't be prouder.

Over 21 years, Give!Guide has raised a whopping \$73 million for 557 different Portland-area nonprofits. And here's the kicker: All of this is made possible by your favorite local and independent media company—Willamette Week.

It's thanks to people like you, the support of literally hundreds of local businesses, and the dedication of thousands of individuals that we can pull off this truly community-centric fundraising effort year after year. You'll find a shout-out to many of the key players at the bottom of giveguide.org — go ahead and show them some love.

This isn't just fundraising; it's people showing up for the Portland metro area and saying, "We care!"



Where the Money Came From


No shocker here — Portland came through like a boss! With most participating nonprofits calling the city home, it's no wonder the generosity flowed heavily from the Rose City and suburbs. But this generosity was coast to coast! Every state, plus D.C., threw in some love, showing that Give!Guide knows no borders — it's a movement.

These 10 states had the most donations (in descending order):

Within Portland, however, our most generous ZIP codes were in Southeast followed by Northeast, Southwest, Northwest, and finally North. It amused us immensely to discover 77 variations on the spelling of Portland. The best? Porgland.

35 & Under Challenge

Young Donors Step Up:
The 35 & Under Challenge

At the heart of Willamette Week's Give!Guide is a bold mission: inspiring a new generation of givers and cultivating a culture of engaged, compassionate philanthropy. That's why we focus on growing the number of donors age 35 and under.

This year, 2,708 young donors gave \$359,572. On average, each one supported three nonprofits. Human Services topped the charts as the most popular category among young donors, with Environment and Community close behind. Thanks to their generosity, 10 outstanding nonprofits each earned a \$1,000 cash prize, sponsored by Tandem Property Management.

The Five Biggest Days

It takes a tremendous amount of time and energy to raise millions of dollars. Here are the five biggest days for Give!Guide 2024 and a peek behind the scenes.

1. \$1,492,488.34 on December 31 — No surprise here, the last day of Give!Guide is always the biggest, and this one sets a record with most raised on a single day! Frankly, we're still stunned.
2. \$1,087,818.35 on December 30 — Calling all culture lovers! This was the final Big Give Day, and it was a spectacular cultural package across three regions of Oregon.
3. \$613,902.64 on December 3 — Giving Tuesday is a global day of generosity that helps with visibility. We doubled down with Big Give Day prizes focused on the best of Portland to bring the focus homeward.
4. \$511,475.23 on December 10 — Believe it or not, \$401,000 of this total was donated by just three people who spread their support across 131 nonprofits. Take note, big donors, we can help you do this, too!
5. \$481,935.79 on December 29 — The second-to-last Big Give Day dug into Portland's love for gardens with prizes from Portland Nursery. It also tapped into the citywide push to the finish line.

Tracking the Generosity

Between November 1 and December 31, giveguide.org saw a surge of generosity, with over 238,000 unique visitors exploring the site. On average, each visitor clicked through 4.6 pages, discovering new causes to support. And the excitement peaked in the final week, drawing more than 64,000 visitors eager to make a difference before the clock struck midnight!

What Got People Talking and Clicking?

On Instagram and Facebook, our biggest moments were on Big Give Days — Big Concert Day, Big Bird Day, and Big Bike Day sparked the most excitement. But when it came to actual clicks, Big Concert Day, Big Portland Day, and Big Drinks Day stole the show!

While this buzz matches our newsletter's click-through rates, it was the Kickoff Alert that got the most inbox action. Thank you for allowing us into your inbox for two months.

Turns out, more than half of our Instagram and Facebook audience was 35-44 years old—clearly, they love giving back! And over on Facebook, Big Flights Day took off with tons of buzz and shares. Cheers to everyone who spread the word and made these moments shine!

1. November 1: This was both Kickoff Day and Big Concert Day featuring Billie Eilish tickets, a hot pairing!
