The following resolution was laid before the house:

**HR 1031**, In memory of Mary Helen VanDeaver of Clarksville.

The chair recognized Representative Landgraf who addressed the house, speaking as follows:

Members, you all know that we serve in a rough-and-tumble place in this house. And this house has a way of bringing out the best in us. And sometimes, if we're being really honest about it—on occasion at least—this house has a way of extracting the worst in us, too. But I can say for certain that there is one member of this body who gives us—and gives this great state—his best, and only his best, every day, consistently, for all 10 and a half years that he's been serving in this body. And in that sense, he is truly a diamond in the rough. In a place where it's easy to draw the ire of others, this man maintains the respect of everyone in this house and in his orbit. In a time when social media views are deceptively the way that we measure our influence, this man is a fountain of quiet and steady wisdom. And by the way, he'll share that wisdom with you if you just ask. In an arena where other forces can easily prevail, this man has quietly stood firmly on his principles—consequences be damned. I think for all the mothers in the room we can agree—or you will agree anyway—that these are the type of traits that any mother would want to see in her child. And the man, our colleague, is who he is because he was raised by a strong, loving, and God-fearing mother. That woman, Mary Helen VanDeaver, is who we memorialize today.

Family and friends will forever cherish their memories of Mary Helen VanDeaver of Clarksville, who passed away on March 27, 2025, at the age of 93. The former Mary Helen Meeks was born in Paris, Texas, on December 27, 1931. She was joined in matrimony to Charles L. VanDeaver on October 13, 1954, and they were blessed with three children—Tommy, Gary, and Renea. While devoting herself to her home and family, Mrs. VanDeaver also used her gifts as a seamstress, making clothes for her family, for herself, and many other women in the community. In fact, she eventually became the proprietor of VanDeaver

Draperies, and she later owned and operated Mary Helen's Dress Shop. She was also a marvelous cook. She loved to entertain and prepare food for events at the First Baptist Church, where she and her husband were long-time, active members.

Through the years, Mrs. VanDeaver's treasured family grew to include six grandchildren, 15 great-grandchildren, and she and her husband shared a fulfilling relationship of 52 years. She lived a full life and a generous life. She was always surrounded by those she loved. And those she loved will forever carry her close in their hearts. And that's why we want to resolve ourselves today, as this house, to pay tribute to the memory of Mary Helen VanDeaver and extend our sincere sympathy to the members of her family—most notably our colleague, our friend, our classmate, my deskmate, Chairman Gary VanDeaver. I know that as we approach Mother's Day weekend, this is going to be a difficult Mother's Day for the chairman. But it's my hope, members, that he finds comfort in knowing that his mother's best qualities, her finest attributes, continue to live on in this world through him, his children, and his grandchildren.

The chair recognized Representative VanDeaver who addressed the house, speaking as follows:

My friends and my family, I wish you could have known my mom. She had a tough beginning in life. She was born into extreme poverty to a single mom at a time when there really were no safety nets for people in that situation. Due to a tough family situation, she wound up having to drop out of school as a teenager. She moved to Dallas and found work. And that was where she began to build a successful career, and she met my dad. But I think it was because of her lack of education that she valued education. And I think that's what instilled in me a love for education. You know, she was the first to put me on a pedestal, but if she ever suspected I was trying to crawl onto that pedestal myself, she was the first to knock me down and bring humility to my life.

I truly appreciate this opportunity. She would be blown away to think that this body paused in the middle of such a busy day to pay tribute to her. She truly lived a very simple life and never imagined that her name would even be spoken on the floor of the Texas House, much less a tribute such as this. So I thank you for that. It means so much to me. And as we approach Mother's Day weekend, I suspect all of us are here because we had a strong mother figure in our lives. For some of us, it may have been a grandmother. It may have been an aunt. But I can't imagine making it to this house chamber without that strong motherly influence in our lives to guide us and direct us. So as you celebrate Mother's Day this weekend, I hope we will all pause and think about the importance that these women played in our lives.

My mother, as I said, lived a very simple life, and she really had a very simple philosophy to life. She always taught me: Love God, love people, and work hard. And I believe maybe that's the key to a happy life and the key to a successful life. So the next thing she would say other than those three things would be, "Quit all this silliness and get back to work." So with that, friends,

thank you so much. You'll never know how much this means to me. And I love every one of you and look forward to continuing to serve with each of you. Thank you.

**HR 1031** was unanimously adopted by a rising vote.

### MAJOR STATE CALENDAR HOUSE BILLS THIRD READING

The following bills were laid before the house and read third time:

#### **HB 5138 ON THIRD READING** (by Shaheen, Metcalf, Leach, Noble, Hull, et al.)

**HB 5138**, A bill to be entitled An Act relating to the duty of the attorney general to prosecute criminal offenses prescribed by the election laws of this state.

#### **HB 5138 - REMARKS**

REPRESENTATIVE SHAHEEN: **HB 5138** restores the authority of the Office of the Attorney General.

REPRESENTATIVE J. JONES: Chair Shaheen, would you agree that we, the legislature, pass laws for people to follow?

SHAHEEN: Yes, I would agree with that.

J. JONES: Didn't the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals, the highest criminal court in this state, say the attorney general has no independent authority to prosecute criminal cases?

SHAHEEN: They said in the *Stephens* case—if that's what you're referring to—that the bill that was passed several sessions ago was flawed and unconstitutional because there was concurrent jurisdiction in the bill that was passed.

J. JONES: So isn't this bill a direct attempt to sidestep *State v. Stephens*, even though the court made it clear that only local prosecutors have that power under our Constitution?

SHAHEEN: No, ma'am. It is not. It addresses the very issues the *Stephens* case brought up, so the bill is constitutional.

J. JONES: Which is why they remanded that case, because it is unconstitutional. Does the author believe the legislature can override a constitutional ruling from our highest criminal court just because it doesn't like the outcome?

SHAHEEN: Again, ma'am, **HB 5138** takes the issues from the opinion and is crafted to address the concerns in the *Stephens* case.

J. JONES: All right. If the attorney general can prosecute without a district attorney's request, wouldn't that violate the separation of powers and concentrate too much power in one office?

SHAHEEN: No, ma'am. The attorney general can prosecute cybercrimes if there's a data breach of over 250 Texans today.

J. JONES: Did the attorney general not talk about the separation of powers in the *Stephens* case?

SHAHEEN: He referenced the *Brady* case if that's what you're talking about.

J. JONES: Who is "he"?

SHAHEEN: It was a case that—

J. JONES: No, you said, "he referenced." Who is "he"?

SHAHEEN: It was a case that the attorney general was defending—the legislation in front of the Criminal Court of Appeals.

J. JONES: What did the Criminal Court of Appeals say?

SHAHEEN: Well, the Criminal Court of Appeals said that you can't have concurrent jurisdiction. You can't have the attorney general and the district attorney both having prosecutorial power. What this piece of legislation does to address that is it time-boxes when a district attorney can prosecute a crime and then when the attorney general can prosecute the crime. They're separate time periods, so it addresses the concern in the *Stephens* case that you're referencing.

J. JONES: In *State v. Stephens*, the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals addressed the constitutionality of the attorney general's authority to prosecute election-related offenses under Texas Election Code, Section 273.021. Would you agree with me on that?

SHAHEEN: The Criminal Court of Appeals found the legislation that was originally passed to be unconstitutional, so what this piece of legislation before the body today does is it addresses the concerns in the *Stephens* opinion.

J. JONES: I'll go back. So you're telling me that in *State v. Stephens*, the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals did not address the constitutionality of the attorney general's authority to prosecute election-related offenses under the Texas Election Code, Section 273.021?

SHAHEEN: So if you look at the opinion on page 16—

J. JONES: You want to bring the opinion to me?

SHAHEEN: What's that?

J. JONES: You want to bring the opinion to me? Since you're referencing something?

SHAHEEN: No, I'll just read it to you. It talks about concurrent jurisdiction on page 16. This is referencing the statute that they found unconstitutional. It says, "The legislature drafted the statute using the words 'may prosecute' and 'may appear.'" This bill before you uses the term "shall." On page 19 of the opinion, it says, "Any attempt to overlap the attorney general's constitutional duties with the county or district attorney is unconstitutional." That's why you have the time box. In the first six months, the district attorney can prosecute. If the district attorney decides not to, then the attorney general can step in.

J. JONES: Isn't it true that the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals reversed the appellate court's decision, holding that Section 273.021 unconstitutionally delegated prosecutorial power to the attorney general, a member of the executive branch, infringing upon the judicial branch's authority? The court emphasized that absent a request from a local prosecutor, the attorney general lacks independent authority to initiate criminal proceedings. Isn't that true?

SHAHEEN: The Criminal Court of Appeals did find the original statute unconstitutional, so that's why this piece of legislation is drafted the way it is.

J. JONES: They actually did find it unconstitutional, which is why they struck down courts and reversed it.

SHAHEEN: Yes.

J. JONES: Because they said it's infringing on the judicial branch's authority. In any case, I'll move on.

SHAHEEN: Okay.

J. JONES: *State v. Stephens* was decided by republican judges. Right?

SHAHEEN: You're talking about there's a majority of republicans?

J. JONES: Yes. The Texas Court of Criminal Appeals.

SHAHEEN: Yes. There's a majority of republican judges.

J. JONES: So for the most part, in *State v. Stephens*—which is dispositive of this issue—the Texas Constitution says prosecution belongs to the local district attorneys?

SHAHEEN: Again, ma'am, there's acknowledgment that the Criminal Court of Appeals found the statute passed by this body several sessions ago unconstitutional. I'm not disputing that. Nobody's disputing that. What I'm attempting to articulate is **HB 5138** addresses the constitutional issues that the Criminal Court of Appeals called out in their opinion. That's why **HB 5138** is constitutional and will survive potential challenges.

J. JONES: Also, isn't it true that *State v. Stephens* was significant because it underscores the constitutional limits on the attorney general's authority in Texas—particularly concerning the prosecution of election-related offenses—which, I believe, speaks directly to this bill?

SHAHEEN: Yes, ma'am. The Criminal Court of Appeals found the former piece of legislation unconstitutional. That's accurate.

J. JONES: Okay. I respectfully suggest it's going to find this piece of legislation unconstitutional. Do you not believe there should be some concern to give a partisan, statewide official the power to override local prosecutors and initiate criminal cases?

SHAHEEN: That's not what this piece of legislation does. What it does is give the district attorney six months to determine whether they want to prosecute a case or not, and if they decide not to, the attorney general has the option of whether he or she wants to.

J. JONES: Actually this bill does exactly that, because it allows the attorney general to come in and override a decision of the local prosecutor. The local prosecutor can evaluate the case, decide there's not a case, and not prosecute. If we pass this bill knowing about *State v. Stephens*, aren't we knowingly, as a body, passing unconstitutional legislation?

SHAHEEN: **HB 5138**, again, reflects the opinion from the *Stephens* case and will be found to be constitutional. We took the issues with respect to concurrent jurisdiction, and it addresses that.

J. JONES: I'm just curious. Are you a lawyer?

SHAHEEN: No, ma'am.

J. JONES: Okay. Well, I stand by what I said before. I believe the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals will absolutely strike this down as unconstitutional if we use it, but let's move on. Okay?

SHAHEEN: Okay.

J. JONES: And I'll say this: Is this really about enforcing the law, or is it about weaponizing it against communities that don't vote the way the attorney general wants? Or local prosecutors that don't prosecute what the attorney general wants them to prosecute?

SHAHEEN: It addresses the concern of election law being violated in our state.

J. JONES: I'll end with this. This is so this body knows with eyes wide open that *State v. Stephens*—the concerns there are still concerns here. If this indeed passes, it's absolutely unconstitutional. I'm certain somebody's going to sue, and the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals is going to come up with the same decision that it made before.

SHAHEEN: Thank you, ma'am.

REPRESENTATIVE TURNER: It was late last night when we heard this bill on second reading, and there was a lot going on. I want to just spend a few minutes talking about what this bill does and why it's a problem.

Let me be the first to say, this is a reasonable debate for the legislature to engage in. It is reasonable for us to debate whether or not we want to give the attorney general the power to prosecute election-related crimes. That's a reasonable debate, but this bill is the wrong vehicle to do it with. It requires a constitutional amendment. If members want to give the attorney general this

power, you need to amend the Constitution. That is clearly the takeaway from the *Stephens* opinion. Contrary to the bill author's intent and his words, this bill does not comport with the *Stephens* decision.

So the *Stephens* decision was in the Court of Criminal Appeals a couple of years ago. The court essentially found that the attorney general does not have the power under the Constitution to prosecute these crimes. I want to read to you a few excerpts from this opinion: "The Constitution of 1876, which our state still operates under, expressly divides the powers of government into three distinct departments—the legislative, executive, and judicial—and prohibits the exercise of any power 'properly attached to either of the others,' unless that power is grounded in a constitutional provision. 'This separation of powers provision reflects a belief on the part of those who drafted and adopted our state Constitution that one of the greatest threats to liberty is the accumulation of excessive power in a single branch of government.' . . . The Texas Constitution contains this explicit separation of powers provision unlike the federal Constitution which contains no express separation of powers provision. Instead, separation of powers is implied through the federal Constitution's structure, dividing government into three branches . . . We have previously held that this textual difference between the United States and Texas Constitutions suggests that Texas would 'more aggressively enforce separation of powers between its branches than would the federal government.'" Think about that for a second. It's important as hell that the way the Texas Constitution is drafted is that it's more aggressive and more serious about protecting those separation of powers than even the federal Constitution, where those separation of powers are very, very well established.

The court continues, "As previously discussed, the enumerated duties of the attorney general, as specified by the Constitution, are limited to inquiring into charter rights of private corporations, suing in state court to prevent private corporations from exercising powers not authorized by law, seeking judicial forfeiture of charters, and providing legal advice to the governor and other executive officers. Notably absent from these enumerations is a specific grant of authority to the attorney general concerning the prosecution of criminal proceedings. Undeterred by this omission, the court of appeals applied an expansive interpretation . . . holding that, because the attorney general may act on behalf of the state against corporations, and because corporations, like elections and elected officials, are wholly creatures of state actions, it follows that the attorney general has authority to prosecute . . . This is a misapplication of the . . . doctrine. The court of appeals disregarded the doctrine's fundamental point: that 'the principle . . . warns against the expansive interpretation of broad language that immediately follows narrow and specific terms, and counsels us to construe the broad in light of the narrow.' . . . Further, the Constitution already grants this authority to county and district attorneys"—as we discussed yesterday on second reading. "Because this is already the specific duty of county and district attorneys, the court of appeals erred by misconstruing the 'other duties' clause to encompass judicial branch duties. To elucidate the absurd results that such an interpretation of 'other duties' would render, Stephens notes that the

Constitution also permits the legislature: to assign the secretary of state and the Water Development Board 'other duties,' to assign notaries public 'such duties as . . . may be prescribed by law,' to assign duties to county clerks and sheriffs." The court says, "If we were to adopt the reasoning of the court below, then the legislature could grant the Water Development Board with prosecutorial authority. Perhaps this example is extreme, but it certainly emphasizes how relying on 'other duties' would render meaningless the separation of powers . . . Absent the consent and deputization order of a local prosecutor or the request of a district or county attorney for assistance, the attorney general has no authority to independently prosecute criminal cases in trial courts. Therefore, while there are some . . . overlapping duties, the Constitution specifically separates the powers of the branches. Any attempt to overlap the attorney general's constitutional duties with county and district attorneys' . . . duties in the sense of a Venn diagram of sorts is unconstitutional. Practically speaking, any overlap is necessarily invitational, consensual, and by request: a county or district attorney must request the assistance of the attorney general. Under the current Constitution, overlap of the constitutional duties of the attorney general and those of district and county attorneys occurs, if at all, on a case-by-case basis."

So members, the court was very clear about this. It was unconstitutional what the attorney general was doing before. Passing this bill will not make it constitutional. It will require a constitutional amendment, which we do not have before us today. The question, members, really is this: Do we care about the rule of law or not? Does the Constitution of this state matter or not? The Constitution is designed to protect the people—protect all of us, protect our rights regardless of who is in power at any given moment. The Constitution is the sturdy, resilient infrastructure of our republic—nationally and in Texas. Much like a reinforced building that can withstand an earthquake or a hurricane, the Constitution protects us regardless of what's happening in the moment, the politics of the moment, and who is in power. Members, we have not always had a republican attorney general. We will not always have a republican attorney general. So before you grant expansive new powers to the attorney general in violation of the Constitution, I hope you'll think long and hard about the long-term implications of doing that.

J. JONES: So gentlemen, Ms. T walked back here and reminded me of something, and she is a lawyer.

TURNER: Yes, she is.

J. JONES: Here is a question: Does this bill, **HB 5138**, limit the AG to a certain time period to sue? Did you see that anywhere?

TURNER: No, not that I have seen.

J. JONES: So there is a time limit for local prosecutors who are elected by the people that live there, but the AG has unfettered discretion of when to bring a lawsuit? Correct?

TURNER: That is absolutely right. And to expand on your point—your question—county and district attorneys, local prosecutors, have a constitutional responsibility and a constitutional duty to prosecute these crimes. The attorney general does not. Why would we limit them but not limit the attorney general, when that office doesn't even have the power?

J. JONES: When we hear the author of this bill talk about, "Oh, we are going to pass another law that lets the AG do what the Constitution prohibits," we believe it then becomes constitutional because we give them six months. So in other words, time limits it. Now, do you see what I see? And what blind people should see? That the Constitution is the Constitution? If it says that the prosecution of criminal cases, especially in the election arena, since *State v. Stephens* related to election-related incidences—this does not cure the Constitution problem?

TURNER: That is absolutely right, Representative Jones. That is my point. I heard the bill author say those things, and that has nothing to do with the fundamental problem. That is why this bill is fatally flawed. It is unconstitutional on its face.

J. JONES: And I will say this: Would this not be a perfect example of why there is a separation of powers? You have a legislative body that wants a law like it wants, and it's like, "I will be damned with the Constitution." They pass the law as the rules of the legislature require. It goes to the senate, and the governor can sign it, and then the judicial branch—which is another branch of government—gets to come and strike it down by the Court of Criminal Appeals and say, "Hey, legislature: No, no, no, no, no. That is against the Constitution."

REPRESENTATIVE BUCY: I was listening intently to your layout and your exchange with Representative J. Jones. I thought it was very important. I thought you all made great points, but if you would, my question is—would you look around the room at our colleagues real quick and notice that I do not think any of them are listening to this exchange on one of the biggest bills. Mr. Speaker, can we get some order in the room? This is a bill that I think you laid out really well, in your opposition, to why we need to oppose this. Unfortunately, our colleagues were chatting about everything else under the sun while you were talking about a bill that deals with the separation of powers. Haven't we done this before? Haven't we gone down this path before in this body?

TURNER: We have, Representative Bucy. And you know, this is an issue that has been much discussed over many years. And I think you have been a leader in exposing some of the fallacies behind these supposed voter fraud investigations that the attorney general's office has undertaken, which ultimately led, in part, to this lawsuit that made it all the way to our state's highest criminal court, the Court of Criminal Appeals. And the court—it was not even a close call. If you read this decision, it is not even a close call. The attorney general has no authority under our Constitution to prosecute these crimes. Their power rests solely and exclusively with local prosecutors—DAs and county attorneys.

BUCY: So in your opposition speech, you started saying this is a debate that is worthy of this body, but this is not the way to debate this. One, by not paying attention and the disrespect you are getting from your colleagues, but two, because this—the courts have ruled, very plain and clear, that we do not have the authority to do this unless we do it through a constitutional amendment. Wouldn't that be correct?

TURNER: That is absolutely right. This comes down to: Do we care about what the Constitution says or not? And if we do not care, then I guess it is okay to pass this bill. But I think we do care. I think you care, and I think—I hope—a majority of this body cares that what the Constitution says matters.

BUCY: The majority of this body, I have heard over and over, say they are strict constitutionalists.

TURNER: Yes.

BUCY: Again, we are throwing the finger to the face of the courts right now, who have said, "We underscore in the majority opinion that we do not have this authority to override the Constitution simply through a bill." We have done this before. We have had this go to the courts, and they have overwritten us. They said, "Do not do it this way." This body had the option to bring a constitutional amendment, did they not, on this matter?

TURNER: Absolutely. I asked Representative Shaheen the same question when we heard this bill in the State Affairs Committee. Why is this not a constitutional amendment?

BUCY: So the conservative court has said if we do this, we would be making the same mistake we made before? We are violating the Constitution if we do this?

TURNER: Well, that is exactly right. This is going to lead to more costly litigation that ties up the attorney general's office, that ties up the Criminal Court of Appeals and lower courts, of course. Why would we do that?

BUCY: We have a lot of fiscal conservatives on this floor. If they vote for this bill, they know—they know just by reading the opinion and recent history—that they will be violating the Constitution. They will be costing taxpayers tons of money, and they will be doing it to end up in the same place that we are today—not having a proper debate, but one that we could have had through a constitutional amendment. Is that correct?

TURNER: That is exactly right.

BUCY: The courts said we do not have this right; we are going about this wrong. If we want to have this debate—if we want to continue to give away the powers that we are this session to the attorney general—this is absolutely wrong. It is fiscally irresponsible. It is a violation of the Texas Constitution. Thank you for your opposition. Let's vote no on this bad bill.

REPRESENTATIVE GERVIN-HAWKINS: Representative Turner, I am not an attorney—

TURNER: Nor am I.

GERVIN-HAWKINS: But what I have heard in this discussion—and I think the greatest level of concern is doing unconstitutional things in a body such as this. My concern is that as our members are making these decisions—no doubt that, obviously, the responses have already been generated. Would you agree with that? In terms of not listening, in terms of not understanding and making good policy? Would you agree with that?

TURNER: Well, it sadly seems that is the case. You know that is one of the reasons I wanted to come up here this morning, Representative Gervin-Hawkins. Because this bill was taken up on second reading late last night after it had been a long day. I know people were tired and distracted with other things. I really want to use this moment on third reading to draw some attention to the seriousness of this bill—how seriously flawed it is and how patently unconstitutional it is. All anyone has to do is read this court decision or listen to the excerpts that I just read from the court decision to know that it is unconstitutional. And if members feel strongly that the AG really needs to have this power, then the proper way to do that is to file a house joint resolution so there would be a constitutional amendment on the ballot for the voters to decide if they want to amend the Constitution to give the attorney general this power. That is the proper way to do this.

GERVIN-HAWKINS: The other thing that I hear—because we know a lot of our DA offices are short-staffed—is when you put a six-month time limit on a local DA's office, we put more pressure, additional pressure, on them. Would you agree with that?

TURNER: Absolutely, absolutely. I do not think it is the job of the legislature to micromanage how our local prosecutors are going about their job. They have got a lot of things to balance. They are investigating and prosecuting violent crimes, murders, and a host of other things. So they have got to balance all that with the priorities of their local community in mind. Why would we try to micromanage them and put some artificial timeline on them? They say we are going to take this away from you and give it to the attorney general—unconstitutionally I would add—because you do not get it done in six months? That is unrealistic and unfair.

GERVIN-HAWKINS: So the reality is a slap in the face to the local DAs. Would you agree with that?

TURNER: Absolutely, and I hear a lot—you and I both hear a lot about how we support local prosecutors. This is not the way to support our local prosecutors. Our local prosecutors need to be empowered and respected, not have their constitutional authority whittled away from an unconstitutional bill.

GERVIN-HAWKINS: Representative Turner, if we give so much power—because I am hearing every bill is going to be resolved through the attorney general—aren't we also putting that additional burden on the attorney general's office that is so humongous that we will end up in—trouble doing things that we need to do that are most important?

TURNER: Look, absolutely. I think the attorney general's office—again, irrespective of who is in the top office of the agency—needs to be focused primarily on child support enforcement in our state, consumer fraud, and enforcing our consumer protection laws. Those are two of the most important functions of the AG, and I would really like the focus of the agency to stay there because our constituents need that help.

GERVIN-HAWKINS: And now, on what the local attorney general should do. You know, when we talk about our various municipalities and areas where our DAs are, right?

TURNER: True.

GERVIN-HAWKINS: We are literally saying after six months, if you have not litigated this, we are going to take that from you. Wouldn't that delay cases?

TURNER: I think it well could. I think it well could delay—create unnecessary delays and costly delays that, again, there is no reason for us to do.

GERVIN-HAWKINS: And not only that—the big thought that I have, too, is the DA is so separated from the local community—I mean not the DA, the attorney general—that they do not even know what is going on in that locale.

TURNER: Well, absolutely. The attorney general's office has 254 counties that they have responsibility to and, again, primary responsibilities, such as child support enforcement, consumer protection. I do not know, realistically, how the attorney general can take any—again, irrespective of who is in the office—how that agency can take up this responsibility that is envisioned in this bill in violation of the Constitution.

GERVIN-HAWKINS: Our members really need to think twice before they dump a whole new basket onto the attorney general's lap and say, "We hope you can resolve it."

TURNER: I agree, and I hope members will vote no on this bill for those reasons.

GERVIN-HAWKINS: Thank you, Representative Turner, and thank you for bringing to light how troubling this is across the board. No matter what party you are in. No matter what party, it is troubling.

TURNER: That's right.

REPRESENTATIVE JOHNSON: We had this discussion a couple weeks ago. A couple of weeks ago, there was almost the exact same language on a bill by Chairwoman Hull that said, "Hey, human trafficking is so important. We really need to step out on human trafficking, and we need to give the attorney general more power just for human trafficking." And do you remember at the time I warned, and I said, "Hey guys, I do not think this is about human trafficking because none of you here are going to want to take a vote that is perceived as being bad against human trafficking." The focus of that was what you have heard here today, which is Texas did it differently. Our founders did it differently. We did not put all the power in a central figure statewide because our founders recognized Lufkin was different from Houston, was different from Odessa, was

different from Brownsville. Texas has always done it differently. We have always been a state that protected and preserved local control. Your voters, your district, your district attorney—we have always said that your local, elected district attorney is the end-all and be-all on criminal prosecution.

What does the AG do? What does the attorney general do? There is a job the attorney general is supposed to do that nobody else in this state can do, and that is collect child support. Are they doing that job? Because I do not know about you, but I know a lot of single moms with kids with deadbeat dads who do not get that done by the AG. Let's talk about doing that job. That is the job. Can the AG collaborate on complex issues? Can the AG step in when a county has an issue? Yes, they can. It is already provided by statute, but it is a collaboration. It is supposed to be a collaboration between your locally elected district attorney to say, "Hey, step in with me here, and help me out on this. Let's collaborate." And there are times when that is a great thing. This is not collaboration. This is hijacking your local DA's power.

Let me tell you: I know you are getting called on this. I know you are getting called on this because I know the DAs—regardless if they are republican or democrat—and I know they are telling you because they told you two weeks ago on this other deal, "Hey man, I am no longer my office." If you do this creep—which we have done—which is to say if you file a case around this subject, you have got to send all that evidence to the AG. Your local DA is no longer the head of your criminal prosecution. Your local DA will now be subservient to whoever is elected as the attorney general. This is not about the current attorney general. This is about whether or not you want to break the system that our founding fathers put in place to maintain local control. This is the slippery slope.

Two weeks ago—watch out, this is not just about human trafficking. And already, before we even got out of here, "Hey, I just need this other little provision. Just give me this other little crime to say, 'Hey, local DA—not you, but me.'" So I agree with the number of people who have said this is unconstitutional. And I will tell you, there are times on this floor where we may take a vote that, in your heart of hearts, you know it is unconstitutional, but you are waiting for someone else in the court system to save the day. We are getting beyond that point. This is an example of whether or not we collectively really care about the Constitution, we collectively really care about small government, or we collectively will protect local control. Protecting your local voters actually means voting no on this bill to set up a program in which you give statewide power to whoever gets elected as AG in the future. Please vote no on this bill.

Also, I do want to thank Chairman Shaheen. I do want to thank that he was willing to work with Chairman Moody and accept the amendment that was put on Chairman Hull's bill. I do appreciate that effort, but that does not make this bill okay. Please vote no.

REPRESENTATIVE C. MORALES: I will be quick with my comments, but as somebody who represents a community that has been repeatedly targeted, lied about, and used as a political scapegoat, I want to call **HB 5138** what it really is:

a power grab. It is a political weapon and a direct attack on communities like mine—Latino communities—under the false, racist narrative that undocumented immigrants are voting in our elections. That is a lie—a flat-out lie. There is no widespread voter fraud—none—and the authors of this bill know it. What this bill really does is give the attorney general unchecked power to override locally elected prosecutors to chase after so-called election crimes that do not even exist. All to push a political agenda and keep communities like mine afraid to vote. My community will be afraid to vote.

Let me tell you who this bill hurts. It hurts the señoras, the abuelitas, and the people in my district who are proud U.S. citizens who may speak Spanish but know exactly what is at stake. They show up to vote because they believe in this democracy. They believe their voices do matter, and now they are being made to feel like criminals—abuelitas made to feel like criminals for simply participating in our democracy. That is shameful.

This bill is not about protecting democracy; it is about suppressing votes. It is about using fear to silence Black and brown voters and to rig the system against us. We should be making it easier to vote, not sending armed investigators to the porches of our grandmas, our abuelas, and the señoras in our community.

REPRESENTATIVE HINOJOSA: I was not going to speak on this bill, but you inspired me to ask this question because you spoke to the fear that people in the Latino community already feel. It will only be enhanced and made worse when we pass bills like the one before us today. In particular, I want to ask about Latino voter participation in your district. Can you speak to the district that you represent and what is already the challenge in Latino participation in the voting process?

C. MORALES: Thank you so much for asking this question. You know, my grandpa was born in Gonzales, Texas, and moved to Houston for work. But he never truly spoke perfect English. He preferred to speak Spanish, but he was a U.S. citizen. He always felt a little ashamed to go and speak in the community because he could only speak perfect Spanish, not perfect English. So those are the kind of people that are going to be terrified to vote, because people are going to think they are not a citizen and they should not be voting. They are going to be questioned. And guess what? He will be able to show his birth certificate or his passport or whatever—but the shame of it all.

HINOJOSA: So your district—I know the congressional district you live in—but I think that the house district you live in, too, is predominantly Latino. Is that the predominant voting population in your district?

C. MORALES: In my particular district it is. It is 70 percent of the voting population, and sadly, for many, many years our community has thought that their votes do not matter. This goes from way, way back. For generations we have felt like we cannot participate—we should not participate—in our democracy. We are finally getting to a point where people realize that voting is important and that it is impacting them when we see what is on the national news. Yes, it does impact them. They want to come out and vote, and that is what this bill is doing.

HINOJOSA: In particular, you recently ran for congress?

C. MORALES: I did.

HINOJOSA: In a district that was majority Latino but was the voting population—the turnout population—in that district majority Latino?

C. MORALES: It was not.

HINOJOSA: Can you speak to that?

C. MORALES: Yes, the district is predominantly Latino; the congressional district—44 percent, the largest demographic. But sadly, those people do not get out and vote. They are afraid, and it is something we need to work on.

#### HB 5138 - REMARKS

J. JONES: We are literally passing a bill that violates the Texas Constitution. The court has already told us—the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals, which is the highest court in Texas for criminal cases—that the attorney general has no independent power to prosecute criminal cases. Putting a time limit on a district attorney does not make that power magically appear. There used to be a cartoon called *Super Friends*. It had two characters, Zan and Jayna, who were known as the Wonder Twins. They could only activate their powers by touching hands and shouting, "Wonder Twin powers, activate!" One would become water, and the other an animal, but only when they work together. Well, let me be clear. The attorney general is not Zan, and this legislature is not Jayna. We don't get to touch hands and activate powers the Constitution says he doesn't have. The attorney general ain't got no superpowers to activate. Vote no.

SHAHEEN: This is a great piece of constitutional law.

(1) the court may not enter an order or make a referral under Subsection (a) unless the attorney general proves by clear and convincing evidence that the interest in the real property that is the subject of the action was purchased or acquired in violation of this subchapter; and

(1) a statement that, under Chapter 310, municipal public libraries are required to complete a review of all materials curated for minors by September 1, 2027;

(2) a statement indicating whether the library has initiated a review of its minor's section to identify and relocate sexually explicit material in good faith compliance with the law; and

(3) the contact information for the library for any public inquiries regarding the review process.

(c) The commission may adopt a model notice template for municipal public libraries to use to meet the requirements of this section.

(d) This section expires January 1, 2028.

(1) a justice of the peace;

(2) a death investigator employed under Article 49.23, Code of Criminal Procedure; or

(3) a medical examiner or an employee of the medical examiner's office employed under Section 3, Article 49.25, Code of Criminal Procedure.

(b) This section applies only to a death investigation professional who sustains a serious bodily injury, as defined by Section 1.07, Penal Code, in the course and scope of employment.

(c) The county, division, and insurance carrier shall accelerate and give priority to an injured death investigation professional's claim for medical benefits, including all health care required to cure or relieve the effects naturally resulting from a compensable injury described by Subsection (b).

(d) The division shall accelerate, under rules adopted by the commissioner of workers' compensation, a contested case hearing requested by or an appeal submitted by a death investigation professional regarding the denial of a claim for

medical benefits, including all health care required to cure or relieve the effects naturally resulting from a compensable injury described by Subsection (b). The death investigation professional shall provide notice to the division and independent review organization that the contested case or appeal involves a death investigation professional.

(e) Except as otherwise provided by this section, a death investigation professional is entitled to review of a medical dispute in the manner provided by Section 504.054.

SECTION \_\_\_\_\_. Section 415.021(c-2), Labor Code, is amended to read as follows:

(c-2) In determining whether to assess an administrative penalty involving a claim in which the insurance carrier provided notice under Section 409.021(a-3), the commissioner shall consider whether:

(1) the employee cooperated with the insurance carrier's investigation of the claim;

(2) the employee timely authorized access to the applicable medical records before the insurance carrier's deadline to:

(A) begin payment of benefits; or

(B) notify the division and the employee of the insurance carrier's refusal to pay benefits; and

(3) the insurance carrier conducted an investigation of the claim, applied the statutory presumptions under Subchapter B, Chapter 607, Government Code, and expedited medical benefits under Section 504.055 or 504.057.

sufficient to provide the adjustments without increasing the unfunded actuarial liabilities of the retirement system. The amount appropriated by the legislature to provide the adjustments must be in addition to any amounts the state is required to contribute to the retirement system under Subchapter B, Chapter 835, or Subchapter B, Chapter 840, Government Code. If the board of trustees of the Employees Retirement System of Texas finds that the legislature did not appropriate money in an amount sufficient to provide the cost-of-living adjustments without increasing the unfunded actuarial liabilities of the retirement system, the retirement system may not make the adjustments.

(c) A defendant to a civil proceeding may file a motion to dismiss the underlying proceeding if the defendant alleges that the defendant is a victim of family violence or abusive conduct perpetrated by the claimant.

(c) The discharge of a handgun by an individual who is a first responder, tactical medical professional, or volunteer emergency services personnel and licensed to carry the handgun under Subchapter H, Chapter 411, Government Code, is outside the course and scope of the individual's duties as a first responder, tactical medical professional, or volunteer emergency services personnel, as applicable.

SECTION \_\_\_\_\_. Subchapter H, Chapter 411, Government Code, is amended by adding Section 411.1884 to read as follows:

Sec. 411.1884. TRAINING COURSE FOR TACTICAL MEDICAL PROFESSIONALS. (a) In this section, "tactical medical professional" means a person who:

(1) is a physician licensed under Subtitle B, Title 3, Occupations Code, or emergency medical services personnel, as defined by Section 773.003, Health and Safety Code; and

(2) is employed or otherwise appointed by the head of a law enforcement agency to provide direct support to a tactical unit of the agency responding to a high-risk incident by providing medical services to victims, officers, and other persons at the incident.

(b) The director, in consultation with the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement, by rule shall establish minimum standards for an initial training course that a tactical medical professional who is a license holder may complete to receive a certification of completion from the department under this section.

The training course must:

(1) be administered by a qualified handgun instructor;

(2) provide classroom training and field instruction in the use of handguns; and

(3) require physical demonstrations of proficiency in techniques learned in training.

(c) The department, in consultation with the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement, by rule shall establish minimum standards for an annual continuing education course that is administered by a qualified handgun instructor for a tactical medical professional who has completed the initial training course described by Subsection (b).

(d) The department shall issue a certificate of completion to a tactical medical professional who is a license holder and who completes the initial training course under Subsection (b) or the continuing education course under Subsection (c), as applicable. A certificate of completion expires on the first anniversary of issuance.

(e) A tactical medical professional is responsible for paying to the course provider the costs of a training course under this section.

SECTION \_\_\_\_ . Section 30.06, Penal Code, is amended by adding Subsection (f-2) to read as follows:

(f-2) It is a defense to prosecution under this section that the license holder is a tactical medical professional, as defined by Section 411.1884, Government Code, who:

(1) holds an unexpired certificate of completion under Section 411.1884, Government Code, at the time of engaging in the applicable conduct; and

(2) was engaged in the actual discharge of the tactical medical professional's duties while carrying the handgun.

**CSHB 21**, A bill to be entitled An Act relating to housing finance corporations; authorizing a fee.

### CSHB 21 - POINT OF ORDER

Representative Dutton raised a point of order against further consideration of **CSHB 21** under Rule 4, Section 32(c)(2), of the House Rules on the grounds that the bill analysis is substantially or materially misleading. The point of order was withdrawn.

This chapter applies only to a residential development at least 90 percent of which is for use by or is intended to be occupied by households [persons] of low and moderate income whose adjusted gross income [~~together with the adjusted gross income of all persons who intend to reside with those persons in one dwelling unit,~~] did not for the preceding tax year exceed the maximum amount constituting moderate income as defined under the housing finance corporation's rules, resolutions relating to the issuance of bonds, or financing documents relating to the issuance of bonds.

(2) On page 5, strike lines 14 through 17 and substitute the following: housing finance corporation if:

(1) at least 50 percent of the units in the multifamily residential development are reserved for occupancy by individuals and families earning less than 80 percent of the area median family income; or

(2) the units in the multifamily residential development are reserved in the manner provided by Section 394.9026(c)(1).

(3) On page 6, between lines 19 and 20, insert the following new subdivision and renumber subsequent subdivisions accordingly:

(4) "Maximum market rent" means, with respect to a particular income-restricted unit, the average annual rent charged for all non-income-restricted units in the development having the same or substantially similar floor plan as the income-restricted unit.

(4) On page 7, line 16, strike "rate".

(5) On page 8, line 20, strike "third" and substitute "first".

(6) On page 8, lines 25 and 26, strike "the development first achieves an occupancy rate of 90 percent" and substitute "construction first begins on the development".

(7) On page 9, strike lines 3 through 7 and substitute the following:  
finance corporation user paid to each taxing unit authorized to impose ad valorem taxes on the applicable property for the applicable tax year an amount equal to that taxing unit's pro rata share of the rent reduction shortfall that exists based on the difference between the minimum rent reduction amount described by Paragraph (A) and the amount of actual rent reduction at the development in the preceding tax year;

(8) On page 12, lines 23 and 24, strike "Subsection (c)" each time it appears and substitute "Subsections (c)(1), (3), (4), and (5)" in each instance.

(9) On page 21, strike lines 22 through 27 and substitute the following:  
Act is not eligible for an exemption under Section 394.905, Local Government Code, as amended by this Act, unless the housing finance corporation that owns the development and any housing finance corporation user, as defined by Section 394.9026, Local Government Code, as added by this Act, associated with the development come into compliance:

(1) not later than January 1, 2026, with Sections 394.9026(c)(6), (7), (8), and (9), Local Government Code, as added by this Act; and

(2) with Sections 394.9026(c)(1), (2), (3), (4), and (5), Local Government Code, as added by this Act, not later than the earlier of:

(A) the end of the 10th tax year following the effective date of this Act; or

(B) the end of the first tax year following a tax year in which:  
(i) existing mortgage indebtedness of the development is refinanced;

(ii) title to the development is conveyed; or

(iii) a sale, conveyance, transfer or assignment, or series of sales, conveyances, transfers or assignments, results in a change in a majority of the beneficial ownership interests of any housing finance corporation user associated with the development.

Amendment No. 1 was adopted.

A housing finance corporation is given a period of time in Section 13(i) to comply with the new requirements of the bill. By its plain terms, this provision is a transition provision, and it does not independently impose, authorize, increase, or change a tax. The chair is unable to find any language in the committee substitute where a tax is imposed, authorized, increased, or changed.

Accordingly, the point of order is respectfully overruled.

(2) an emergency services district created under Chapter 775, Health and Safety Code, unless the applicable corporation has entered into a written agreement with the district to make a payment to the district in lieu of taxation, in the amount specified in the agreement.

### CSHB 21 - POINT OF ORDER

Representative Dutton raised a point of order against further consideration of **CSHB 21** under Rule 4, Section 32(c)(1), of the House Rules. The speaker overruled the point of order, announcing his decision to the house as follows:

Mr. Dutton raises a point of order against further consideration of **CSHB 21** under Rule 4, Section 32(c)(1), on the grounds that the background and purpose statement in the bill analysis is substantially or materially misleading.

The background and purpose statement, in part, contains two uncontested factual statements. First, that housing finance corporations (HFCs) operate outside the territorial jurisdiction of their sponsoring entities; and, second, that they remove property from local tax rolls. The further statement that there is a lack of a benefit to taxpayers or renters is a reasonable inference from these uncontested statements and explains the author's purpose for the bill. See 88 H. Jour. 4394 (2023). The legislative findings under Section 394.002, Local Government Code, simply state hoped-for benefits of establishing HFCs and do not mean that there is no basis for the opinion of the author. Any disagreement here is one of policy, not procedure.

Accordingly, the point of order is respectfully overruled.

Representative Talarico raised a point of order against further consideration of **HB 2734** under Rule 4, Section 32(c)(1), of the House Rules. The speaker sustained the point of order, announcing his decision to the house as follows:

Mr. Talarico raises a point of order against further consideration of **HB 2734** under Rule 4, Section 32(c)(1), on the grounds that the background and purpose statement in the bill analysis is substantially or materially misleading.

There are just two statements in the bill analysis that relate to providing "background information on the proposal." The first is a vague statement that a local prosecutor made statements that fraud generally was occurring in a locality outside the prosecutor's jurisdiction. The chair notes that the bill is not bracketed or limited to that locality.

The other is a conclusory statement that the bill author informed the committee of a "general need to mitigate the potential damage to public assistance programs." Because neither statement provides any information specific to the proposed measure necessary to help members make an informed vote, they are substantially and materially misleading in purporting to provide the information required by the rule. See 88 H. Jour. 4394 (2023).

Accordingly, the point of order is well-taken and sustained.
