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YOU WILL NEED

A4 thick card 

2 split pins 

thin cord 

1 bead 

scissors / craft knife 

decorating stuff 

* Children should be supervised by an adult due to cutting & small parts involved.

TO START

Print or transfer the template onto the thick card and cut out.

pierce holes, being careful not to exceed the size on the template.

DECORATE

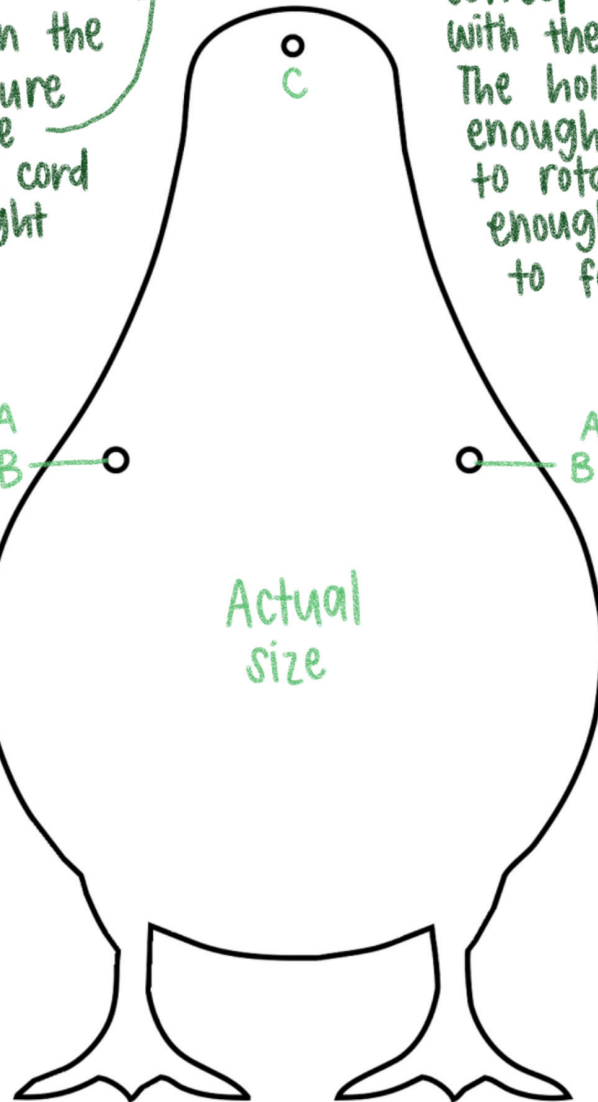
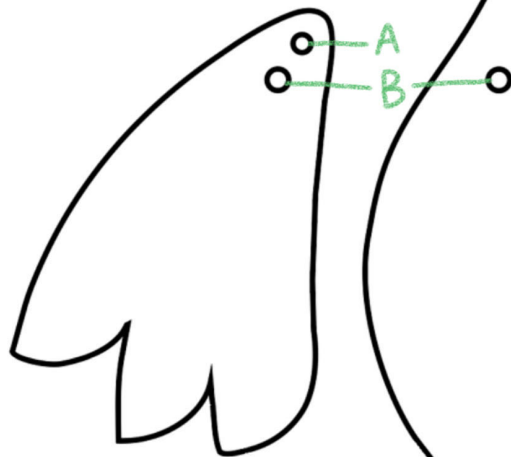
your pigeon's body + wings!

TEMPLATE + ASSEMBLY

STEP 1

Tie the wings together using the top holes (A) on each wing with the thin cord.

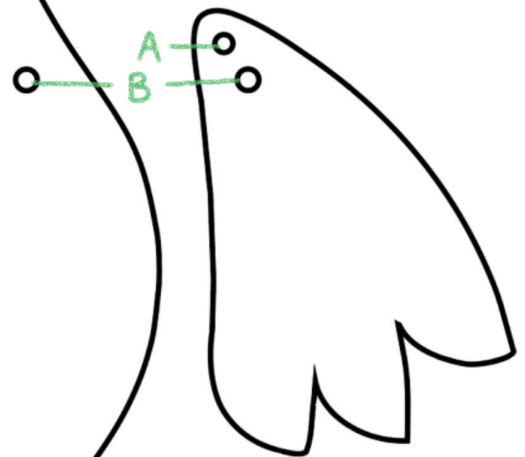
The distance between the wings should measure $\sim 3.5\text{cm}$, or when the wings are down, the cord should appear straight across the body.



STEP 2

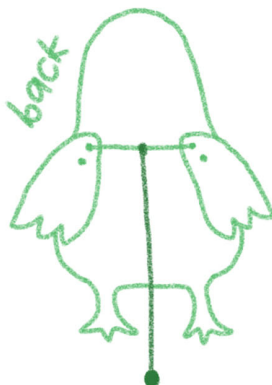
Attach the wings to the pigeon's body at the corresponding empty holes (B) with the split pins.

The holes should be loose enough to allow the wings to rotate freely but small enough for the split pins to feel secure.



STEP 3

Tie a piece of cord (20cm in length) in the centre of the wing string so that it hangs longer than the pigeon's body. Attach a bead to the end of this string to create the pulling mechanism.



STEP 4

Using another 20cm piece of cord, make a loop (to hang up or to hold) and attach it to the hole at the top of the head (C).

And then, you have a completed flapping pigeon!!!
