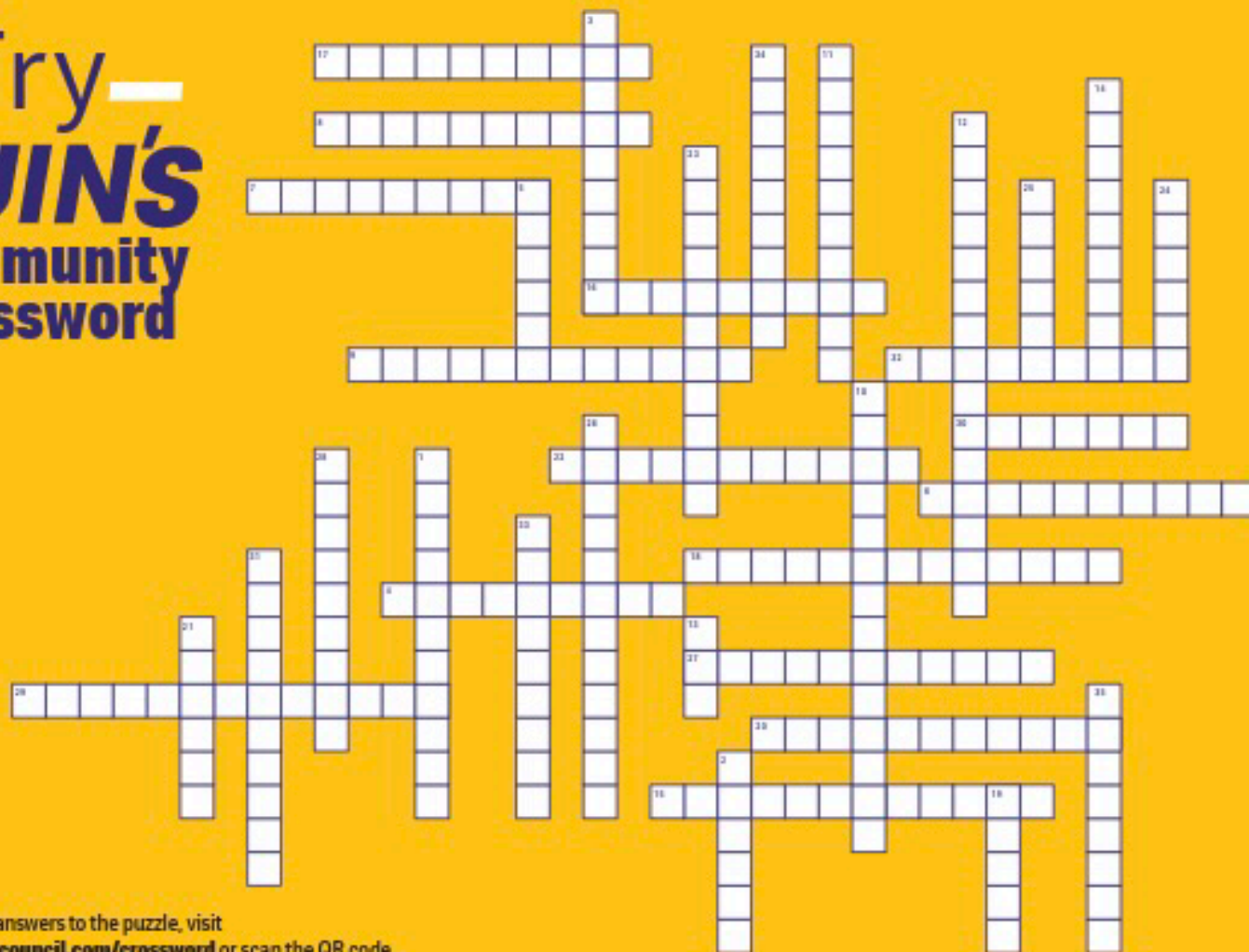


Try QUIN'S Community Crossword
